WHO WE ARE

The Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) is a mandatory enrollment program, designed to coordinate permanent change of station assignments for active duty sponsors who have a family member with special needs.



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
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FORA

EFMP enrollment requires completion of the DD Form 2792, outlining the medical requirements of family members with special needs. This form must be updated every three years, or sooner, if requirements for care change. Some TRICARE authorized providers have begun charging families for completion of this form. Absent reimbursement or regulation, authorized provider charges to families are inconsistent, and in some cases, cost prohibitive for families. The Marine Corps believes that families should not bear the cost of form completion to comply with a DOD-mandated program, and has instituted a reimbursement process.

"If circumstances change prior to the 3 year update, a new DD form 2792 may be submitted. When the update is a result of an EFMP assignment review recommendation, only one update within a 12 month period will be authorized for reimbursement.
